Screening Checklist: Sound

•	As you analyze a shot or scene, carefully note the specific <i>sources</i> of sound in that shot or scene
•	Also keep notes on the <i>types</i> of sound that are used in the shot or scene.
•	Note carefully those moments when the sound creates <i>emphasis</i> by accentuating and strengthening the visual image.
•	Does the sound in the shot, scene, or film as a whole help develop <i>characterization</i> ? If so, how does it do so?
•	In the film overall, how is music used? In a complementary way? Ironically? Does the use of music in this film seem appropriate to the story?
•	Do image and sound complement one another in this film, or does one dominate the other?
•	Does this film use <i>silence</i> expressively?

•	In this film, do you hear evidence of a comprehensive approach to sound—one, specifically, in
	which the film's sound is as expressive as its images? If so, explain why you think so.
